What is our Calling?

Since I joined the Board of World's CE Union we have been struggling with the questions, „What shall the WCEU be doing and what can it do?“ These questions are about our mission and our resources. As Christians we are called to join in Christ's mission. Jesus Christ tells his disciples: „As my Father has sent me, even so send I you.“ (John 20:21). This the general calling of all who follow Christ, but what is the specific mission of World's CE Union? A few years ago the WCEU Board agreed on the following statement: „Our purpose it to support local churches across cultural and denominational boundaries to call young people to Christ and to equip them for holistic service.“ Is this what the national CE unions and local CE societies expect of WCEU?

The second question is closely linked to the first: What can we do with the resources available? World's CE Union is not a big organization. Basically the work of WCEU depends on the National Unions who are willing to share their resources for the common mission of CE. This includes finances, materials that can be used by CE societies and churches and people who work and pray for WCEU. Let's share our expectations and resources to work together for the mission of CE worldwide.

News from the WCEU

About CEI and WCEU

Time and again Endeavorers have been confused by the two names 'World's CE Union' and 'CE International', which seem to say the same. But actually the WCEU was founded 1895 and incorporated 1902 by the same leaders of the CE movement (Clark, Shaw, Baer, Wells and others) who had formed before the United Society of CE as legal vessel for the Christian Endeavor work in North America.



The WCEU was meant to look after the development of CE in countries outside Northern America. For decades mainly American Endeavorers run the WCEU rather as a committee of the International Society of Christian Endeavor (ISCE), mainly distributing subsidies to needy national unions.

Dr. Francis Clark was the president of ISCE (which had replaced the United Society) until 1925 and of WCEU until his death in 1927.

ISCE decided about 50 years back to appear in public as CEI

(Christian Endeavor International). CEI is "International" because CE Societies and Unions in Mexico, Canada and in the United States, including American Samoa and Hawaii were part of it. In contrast WCEU is an umbrella for all national CE unions worldwide including CEI.

CEI lost in the course of the last decades almost all societies and State Unions and subsequently its influence on worldwide level. The WCEU became gradually more important for the CE movement because of the support and influence of non-American CE Unions.

CEI has made some radical and painful decisions - for some supporters - since Timothy Eldred, a very adventurous pastor, has been appointed Executive Director. The organizational structure has changed, the persons who constitute board and committees of CEI are completely new (with hardly any CE experience) and the approach to propagate CE is different. A new "brand name" - **endeavor** - was chosen. CEI tried and tries with a number of campaigns mainly via internet to



revive Christian Endeavour in North America.

The internet does not have boundaries. So CEI actions and programs have been used (or at least looked at) by churches and youth from many parts of the world. One very promising campaign is the "pray with youth program" (see page 2).

So far CEI has not made attempts to organize the users of their programs, but is ready to connect those people with existing CE groups.

News from National Unions

Africa

Côte d'Ivoire

On invitation by the small union Effort Chrétien de Côte d'Ivoire (ECCI) WCEU General Secretary Andreas A. Rudolph held a seminar on Christian Endeavor in Abidjan from June 16.-20.

CE in Côte d'Ivoire is a group of pastors of independent churches in the Ivorian capital. They are very busy evangelizing, but have no self responsible youth groups. The principal ideas of CE were explained to the about 20 participants. It became obvious that in the hierarchic African society Christian Endeavor does not work in its original form. CE needs to be adapted to suit a youth whose self-dependence is not encouraged by the authorities.

Americas and Caribbean

USA

We will be rolling out the 'Pray with Youth Campaign' again this summer with **September 11**, being the **Global Pray-with-Youth-Sunday**. Last time we presented this challenge, churches of many denominations from 56 nations responded. Again, we will offer the materials for free to any congregation who wishes to be involved, as they pray for God's call on the lives of this generation to rise up and take action for Jesus Christ and His Church. The fruit will be seen not in mere numbers but in young people discovering who they are in Christ, owning their faith, and living their calling.

Asia

India

Meeting CE in India and Nepal

To learn about the state of CE in India (CEil) A. Rudolph visited three areas with strong CE presence and met mainly regional leaders. The Indian CE - one of the oldest national unions - is challenged by its great diversity of languages, cultures, churches and the vast distances of the sub-continent. There are no full-time workers in CEil. In South India A. Rudolph met the Youth Coordinators of the CSI Diocese Nagercoil, representing 500 CE groups. In Madras he met the CEil officers. In Bhubaneshwar, Orissa he attended a district CE conference. In North-East India, an area partly entirely Christian, A. Rudolph could meet with some members of the regional board for personal conversation.

CEil thrives where individuals whole heartedly work for Christ and His church. Lack of national coordination and strategies for the future cripple CE in India.

Nepal

CE-Kathmandu, Nepal organised a one day Youth Seminar on 21 August in Aashish Presbyterian Church. Established Christian specialists presented useful information on the subjects of Responsibilities of the Christian Youth, The Generation Gap, Worship and Music and Substance Abuse. Over 50 youth and teenagers attended the event. Secretary of CE-Nepal presented a report on the activities of CE-Nepal and Rev Andreas Rudolph gave an introduction of WCEU. The Programme was conceived and designed by Coordinator of CE - Kathmandu and conducted by Treasurer of CE-Nepal.

CE is in Nepal since 1993. The National Union was formed 1998. There are about 40 societies mainly in the Eastern Region of Nepal. About 500 youth are now members of CE in the poverty

stricken country which was a Hindu kingdom until 2008.

More than 500 young people gathered May 6-8 for this year's FÜGGÖleges (Vertical) youth conference in Cluj's Two Tower Reformed Church. Promotion had been created by young Transylvanian people well ahead: <http://www.fuggoleges.ro/index.php/site/index/56>

The majority of the participants were 17-19 of age. Guests came from Hungary, Ukraine and Germany too. The main speaker of the conference organized by CE Union's Genezius Association and two local Reformed churches was Rev. Jozsef Csomos jr. from



Miskolc (Hungary). He spoke on 'Sex is good' and 'Destroying Christian myths'.

On the second day different speakers in 15min. presentations talked about topics like: 'Do you know your real motivations?' (Sandor Fazakas), 'In the net of performance and expectations' (Eszter Berke, Timea Balogh), 'Masturbation or abstinence?' (Sandor Berke Jr.), 'What influences are you shaped by?' (Istvan Imreh), 'Let's pour fresh water in the glass' (Pal Mike).

Besides lectures and group discussions participants could enjoy themselves during



the optional sport, entertaining and leisure time activities (including free hug in the city and flash mob in one of the local malls), could take part in forum discussions, have a chat in the café tent and could meditate, pray and sing during the musical devotions, the starting point of the second and third day's morning. Saturday afternoon there was an optional 5 hour marathon forum with the well known Hungarian writer Peter Varga and his book 'Spielhozni'.

At the end the participants attended the local churches Sunday morning service. This time the sermon was very special for the local congregation, too, because of the youthful decorations in the church and the hot topic (sexuality) addressed from the pulpit titled 'After all: Grace' (Peter Visky).

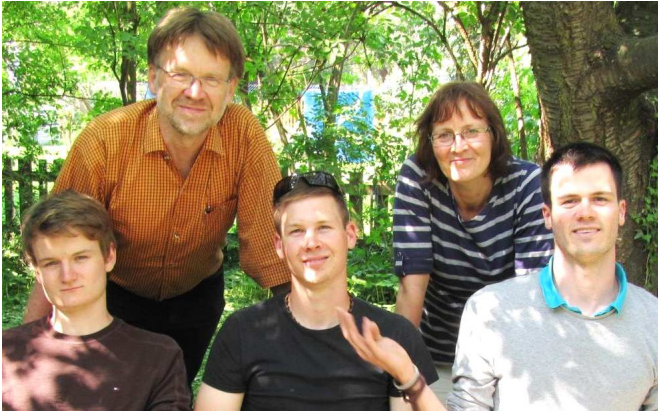
Who is... ?
